An Update to the 2011 Pew Report Card:

The State Of Children's Dental Health: Making Coverage Matter

In 2011, The Pew Center on the States, a division of The Pew Charitable Trusts, released The State of Children's Dental Health: Making Coverage Matter. This report graded states' ability to serve insured and soon-to-be insured children and compared results to 2010 grades. In 2018, Pennsylvania completed their own report card to monitor for any changes and improvements.

Pennsylvania met two of eight policy benchmarks aimed at addressing children's dental health needs in 2010 and increased to three of eight benchmarks in 2011.

In 2018, Pennsylvania meets five of eight policy benchmarks.
