You can help people achieve health and wellness while maintaining a flexible work schedule and choosing an educational path that suits your lifestyle.

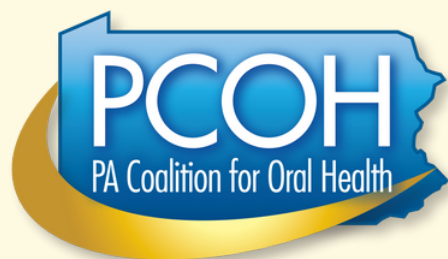

## In-demand Dental Careers in PA



### CERTIFIED COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER

Median Annual Income \$48,860

- High school diploma
- Works in the community
- Promote wellness by helping people adopt healthy behaviors



### DENTAL ASSISTANT

Median Annual Income \$38,600

- High school diploma
- Assists dentist chairside
- Sterilizes equipment
- Typically x-ray certified
- Supervised by a dentist



### EXPANDED FUNCTION DENTAL ASSISTANT

Annual Income\* \$35k-\$50k

- Some college/work experience
- Places fillings and sealants
- Performs fluoride treatments
- Supervised by a dentist



### REGISTERED DENTAL HYGIENIST

Median Annual Income \$77,810

- Associate or Bachelor's Degree
- Performs x-rays, cleanings, gum treatment, sealants, fluoride, etc.
- Supervised by a dentist



### PUBLIC HEALTH DENTAL HYGIENIST

Annual Income\* \$50k-90k

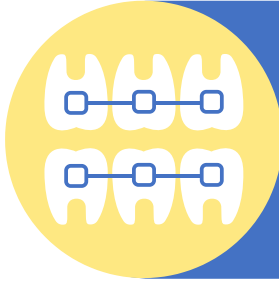
- RDH License + certification requirements
- Performs dental hygiene services in public health settings without dentist supervision



### DENTIST

Median Annual Income \$163,220

- Graduate degree (DMD/DDS)
- Performs fillings and repairs teeth
- Can extract teeth, perform gum surgeries, and screen for oral cancer
- Small business owner or work as an employee or partner



### DENTAL SPECIALIST

Annual Income\* \$175,000-\$250,000

- Additional 2-3 years education beyond DMD/DDS
- Specialize in endodontics, oral & maxillofacial surgery, pediatrics, orthodontics, etc.
