Existing benefits

Benefit limit exceptions

Root canals, crowns/caps, and gum disease services require an approved benefit limit exception (BLE) or program exception in order for the service to be covered.

Ask your dental provider to complete the [“Dental Benefit Limit Exception Request Form”](#) on PA.gov.

* Limited to one set per lifetime without an approved dental benefit limit exception.

Eligibility:

Adults ages 19-64 with a household income less than:

- **\$19,391/year** (household of 1), or
- **\$39,900/year** (household of 4), or
- **less than 133%** of the federal poverty level

Benefits may be different for:

- Adults who are elderly (65+), blind, and/or disabled
- Families with children younger than the age of 21
- People with special medical assistance conditions
